Regulations and General Information - Music

- **1.** Where age limits are specified, the age must be reckoned as on 1st February 2020.
- 2. In all 'Own Choice' classes, copies of the pieces must be provided for the adjudicator at the time of the competition. If the performance is from memory then the adjudicator must be given the original copy. Competitors must recognise that using two photocopies of the music is illegal. Failure to provide the adjudicator with a copy or to provide one original copy of the music will result in the entry being classified as non-competitive and a prize cannot be awarded. All copies will be destroyed after the event by the section head. Also see note 4.
- **3.** Copyright law can apply to music, typography, lyrics and for use in a public performance. The Watford Festival can be held liable for misuse of downloaded copies. For this reason the same rules apply to downloads as to photocopies.
- **4.** Times stated in the syllabus should not be exceeded. Performances that overrun may be ended prematurely.
- **5.** Original copies may be purchased from Perfect Pitch, 72 The Broadway, Chesham; Chimes Music Shops (Academy Chimes, Kensington Chimes, Barbican Chimes and Ealing Chimes) see www.chimesmusic.com; or online at www.musicroom.com. Photocopying of copyright material (or copying by any other method) is illegal unless permission has been obtained from the copyright holder. However an exception has been agreed for 'Own Choice' works. This permission specifically does not apply to set works.

Competitors are advised that this permission applies only to copyright holders who are members of The Music Publishers Association (6th Floor, Two Pancras Square, London, N1C 4AG). It is the competitors' own responsibility to ensure that they seek permission to copy directly from any copyright holder whose name does not appear on the MPA's list.

This permission does NOT apply to making copies for the accompanist who should always be given an original copy from which to work.

6. For postal entries (Choral) competitors should provide a stamped addressed envelope if they wish to be notified as to the date, time and place of the class or classes for which they have entered. If making an online entry (Vocal, Piano, Strings, Woodwind and Brass) these details will be emailed to the applicant.

The Festival Programme will be ready by mid-February and a copy can be obtained for £3, including P&P, from Mrs Sylvia Moring - address on the front cover (cheques payable to 'The Watford Festival'). They are also available at all Festival sessions. Competitors or teachers who have not received a

- timetable one week before The Festival opening date should contact the appropriate section leader, or view the timetable summary at www.watfordfestival.co.uk.
- 7. Certificates will be awarded in all classes up to the age of 19 years. Medals will be awarded in classes up to the age of 14 years, with the exception of groups exceeding four in number. Trophies and scholarships will be awarded subject to a minimum mark of 85 being gained.
- **8.** All trophies presented at the Festival are the property of The Festival and must be returned at least six weeks before the next Festival. Holders are responsible for any loss or damage, which must be reported immediately to the Honorary Secretary giving full particulars.
- **9.** For postal entries (Choral) cheques and postal orders should be made payable to 'The Watford Festival'. If making an online entry (Vocal, Piano, Strings, Woodwind and Brass) payment is made when entering. Entry fees cannot be refunded if, for any reason, a competitor is unable to attend.
- **10.** Competitors may not communicate directly or indirectly with the adjudicators and must accept their decision.
- **11.** The Festival Committee reserves the right to substitute adjudicators or to engage additional adjudicators and to hold competitions on dates and at places other than those notified in the syllabus. Any class may be withdrawn or rearranged should the number of entries warrant it.

- **13.** No video or flash photography is permitted during the performances. This is to avoid disturbance to the performers, to comply with copyright regulations and in accordance with the Watford Festival Child Protection Policy (see p12).
- **14.** Unpleasant behaviour towards our volunteers, adjudicators or other competitors will not be tolerated.
- **15.** Children **16** and under must be accompanied by and remain the responsibility of parents, carers, guardians, chaperones and teachers.
- **16.** Soliciting of business is not permitted at the Festival.

Adjudicator Kristy Swift

Kristy trained in Australia, and relocated to the United Kingdom after winning Australia's largest and most prestigious award for singers, the Herald Sun Aria. Initially a pianist, Kristy began teaching in 1994 at the Encore Music School in Brisbane, Australia, and has since taught singing and piano privately and in several secondary schools in Australia and the United Kingdom. These include Melbourne Girls' College, Brighton Grammar School (Australia), Wycombe Abbey, and her current teaching position at Wellington College in Crowthorne, Berkshire.

As an opera singer, Kristy has performed solo roles with numerous companies and orchestras, including the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, the London Symphony Orchestra, the MDR Radio Orchestra at the Leipzig Gewandhaus, and for the Wexford, Buxton and Iford festivals, among many others. Her solo vocals are also on the soundtrack of the recent Hollywood remake of The Magnificent Seven.

When not performing and teaching, Kristy is a freelance adjudicator, and an examiner for the ABRSM.

Adjudicator Tessa Uys

Born in Cape Town into an exceptionally musical and theatrical family Tessa Uys is one of South Africa's most distinguished

concert pianists.

Aged 7, she gave her first public performance and made her concerto debut at 13 with the Cape Town Municipal Orchestra conducted by David Tidboald. At 16, whilst still at school, she won a Royals Schools Associated Board Scholarship and continued her studies at the Royal Academy of Music in London where she studied with Gordon Green. Here she won many prizes, and in her final year was awarded the top prize, the Macfarren Medal. Further studies in London with Maria Curcio and in Siena, Italy with Guido Agosti. Shortly after this, Tessa Uys won the Royal Overseas League competition.

During the past three decades, Tessa Uys has established herself

During the past three decades, Tessa Uys has established herself an impressive reputation, both as concert performer and as a broadcasting artiste, performing at many of the major concert venues throughout the world. She is also in demand as examiner,

teacher and adjudicator.

Tessa Uys made the first broadcast recordings of the Godowsky transcriptions of 12 Schubert songs for both BBC Radio 3 and

Radio Hilversum in Holland. She has given many recitals at the Wigmore Hall, as well as at St John's Smith Square, and Southbank.

Tessa Uys has played under such distinguished conductors as Sir Neville Marriner, Walter Susskind and Louis Fremaux, Matthias Baemert and Nicholas Kraemer. She has also enjoyed the distinction of working with the film director John Schlesinger on his film *Madame Sousatzka*, starring Shirley MacLaine. In 1994 she was elected an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music. In the year 2000, to mark the 250th anniversary of Bach's death, she recorded the Goldberg Variations released as a double CD for GSE Claremont records.

In recent years, Tessa Uys arranged an emotive journey of a Bluethner grand piano. The piano belonged to her German-born mother, who took it from Berlin to Cape Town in the late 1930s. Now the instrument has made it's final voyage back to the land of it's creation, where it occupies the pride of place at the Berlin Jewish Museum, completing an elegant parabola from Nazi Germany and Apartheid South Africa to new eras in both lands.

- 1. There are no restrictions applying to multiple entries, other than the age limits or levels that are specified, or those stated above, but competitors are not allowed to present any piece in more than one class.
- 2. The competitor who is judged the most outstanding performer in the 2020 classes may be invited to enter for the Emanuel Trophy Competition at the 2021 North London Music Festival. The invitation will be issued by the Section Leader on the recommendation of the adjudicator.
- **3.** A copy of the music must be provided for the adjudicator. See No.2 and 3 of Regulations and General Information. **This rule about original copies and photocopies will be strictly applied.**
- 4. Please time your pieces carefully and make sure they do not exceed the time limit. Where there is a time limit specified the performance may be judged only to that point and may be terminated.
- 5. Classes with fewer entries may be amalgamated for adjudication.
- 6. Choose music carefully. i.e. do not play a Grade 6 level piece in a grade 3 4 level class.
- 7. If your student is playing in C20, you are responsible for playing the accompaniment; (namely the orchestral accompaniment), or to provide an accompanist for them.
- 8. Duets and Trios may now be for one or two pianos.

It is imperative that teachers, parents, guardians or carers read the policy overleaf and make arrangements with reference to its contents

Watford Festival Child Protection Policy

1. Purpose and function of organisation

The object of the Watford Festival (The Festival) is to advance, promote and encourage the education of the public in the Arts. In particular, it offers an equal opportunity to all members of the community, mainly young people, to take part and benefit from entering classes on a competitive basis with professional adjudication, together with the chance to perform at concerts and finales before a public audience.

2. The Festival environment

The Festival aims to provide a caring environment with the highest possible protection for children and vulnerable adults. It is the policy to ensure, as far as is reasonable and practicable, a safe environment for all attendees to The Festival. The Festival is independent of the venues in which the events take place. Whilst every effort is made to provide a safe environment at all times **children under 18 remain the responsibility of parents, carers, guardians, chaperones and teachers** who should be aware of potential dangers such as doors or uneven surfaces. Performers, teachers, parents, guardians, carers and chaperones should be particularly aware that there may be hazards backstage.

3. To whom does this Policy apply?

This policy applies to everyone connected with the Festival. It applies especially to children aged 18 or under and recognizes the differing needs of individual children and those from ethnic and other minority groups. It also applies to entrants with special needs or disabilities and to vulnerable adults, where their needs are notified to the festival prior to attendance. The child protection officer can be contacted if there is any concern about a situation at a venue.

4. Festival personnel

The administration of The Festival is carried out by the members of the Management Committee, comprising trustees, section leaders and other officers. Relevant members are DBS checked. During Festival events, section leaders are assisted by volunteers who have been recommended to the organisers, and who are considered suitable for the position by the organisers. Their names and addresses and attendance at the festival are recorded. Volunteers **are not** DBS checked. All Festival personnel wear visual identification and at each venue, one person will act as 'day captain' to deal with any problem that may arise.

5. Preparation for attendance at the Festival

A copy of the Watford Festival Child Protection Policy will be printed on the reverse of each syllabus entry form for the information of every parent, guardian or carer. It can also be viewed on the Watford Festival website. Where parents cannot attend with their children, they must send their child with another responsible adult who will supervise them at all times. An unaccompanied child aged 16 and under will not be allowed to participate in the Festival.

6. Performance, rehearsal and changing areas

Whilst Festival personnel will always be present in performance areas whilst performances are in progress, warm-up and rehearsal areas will only be monitored or stewarded on an occasional basis. At most venues, changing facilities, whilst restricted, are available for either gender. At larger theatre venues where changing rooms are made available, mixed gender groups may have to share the same facilities. At all venues there are separate toilet facilities for each gender. In all cases, there is no supervision by Festival staff of these changing room and toilet facilities. Children may not be left unattended in these areas, and must be accompanied by a designated adult.

7. Photographs, videotapes and press photography

Apart from press photography as described below, no photography, filming or video recording is permitted in the performance areas. No photos of children may be posted on social media sites without the consent of the child's parents or guardian. No press photography is allowed without the permission and direction of Festival personnel. It is common practice at The Festival to invite press attendance to photograph individual or groups of competitors. Written permission will be sought from the accompanying adult of any child included in such photos.

8. Legislation and guidance that supports this Policy

We are committed to following the requirements for UK legislation in relation to safeguarding children and vulnerable adults and to following good practice recommendations.

9. Policy review

The Management Committee of the Watford Festival will constantly review this Policy, improving it as necessary.
